4.	Trustee Update – Shelley Kinley	3) The Board supports Trustee Shali Baziuk's run for Vice President of the Alberta School Boards Association once again for the 2023-2025 term. She has served as director for Zone 5 since 2019 and is the current incumbent.

- 4) RVS Teachers were recognized on World Teachers' Day. We thank the 1048 RVS teachers for the important and exceptional work they do every day to support our students. You are appreciated!!
- 5) An Ad Hoc committee has been struck to plan, develop and deliver our proposed presentation 'Onboarding for School Board Success' at the National School Boards Association conference. A proposal was submitted, and we were chosen to present at the National Conference in April.
- 6) The Board approved their organization wide strategic plan in December of 2022 and part of that process is annual reporting on the defined performance measures tied to the priorities. It is part of our ongoing accountability commitment. The report is available at <a href="https://www.rockyview.ab.ca">www.rockyview.ab.ca</a>.
- 7) For our first exemplary practice presentation, we had the winners of the Level Up Calgary Season 2 Competition which ran from February to June 2023. Over 500 participants were involved from Rocky View Schools, Calgary Board of Education and the Calgary Catholic School Division. The students took part in the competition which involved designing virtual sustainable real-life public spaces in Calgary using Minecraft. Our RVS students came home with numerous medals. They enjoyed the experience immensely and gained a lot from this real life yet virtual experience.

For our second exemplary practice, we had Jander Talen, a Grade 10 Teacher at Cochrane High School, present. He was selected to be Grosvenor Teacher Fellow the National Geographic Society and go on expedition to the Galapagos Islands. He shared his trip with us, and how he uses connection to the environment and outdoor education with his students in a program called ROAMS (Rivers, Oceans and Mountain School).

8) Space for students continues to be a Board Advocacy focus. Together with the RVS' Communications team we are still setting our goal at securing full construction funding for four schools that have received planning and design funding in the 2023/2023 school year.

9) RVS' 2022/2023 Space for Students Advocacy Plan has been honored by the Canadian Association of Communicators in Education (CACE) with a BRAVO! Award. The award recognizes exemplary work and

will be presented during the annual CACE conference in Montreal at the end of October. A huge congratulations to our Communications team.

- 10) Significant enrolment growth in Airdrie, Cochrane and Chestermere 990 more students or 3.5% increase from 2022/2023. The overall utilization is 93% up from 87% last year. Of the new RVS students, 50% are in Airdrie. The current utilization in Airdrie's High School is 110%. Chestermere schools are at 98% utilization overall. Cochrane has 100% utilization at both of their high schools as well.
- 11) The Board provided an orientation session on September 27th for school council members. The session is intended to support school councils by providing information and engaging in dialogue. The presentation is available on the RVS website. School Council executive are invited to join us October 26th at 5:30 7:30 at the RVS Education Centre to connect and learn from each other. Please RSVP.
- 12) A multi-faceted Public Engagement has been launched to Balance Airdrie Student Spaces. We will begin a consultation plan this fall Phase 1 to provide stakeholders with information, resources an an opportunity to ask questions about the proposed solutions. Phase 2 begins in 2024 and will offer stakeholders the opportunity to provide feedback, both in person and online. Changes to come into effect in the 2025/2026 school year. Some may be implemented as early as the 2024/205 school year.
